### Who takes a ND Math Credit Exam?

Notre Dame offers optional math credit exams for students who have taken calculus, statistics, or linear algebra and differential equations but do not have Advanced Credit for these courses. If you have credit for a course, you should not take the credit exam for it.

The ND Math Credit Exams are primarily intended for students who feel confident in their knowledge and want to advance more quickly in the math sequence required for their intended college/school or major.

For example, if you took calculus in high school but do not have AP or IB HL credit and want to take Calculus II in your first semester, then you should take the Calculus I credit exam. If you took calculus in high school and want to take Calculus I in your first semester, you should not take the credit exam.
